

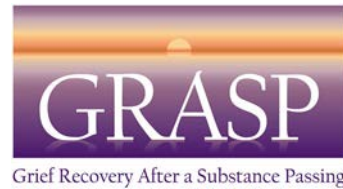
Broken No More is a not for profit organization, with no paid staff, fancy offices or expense accounts. Any money donated goes directly to our shared goals.

Broken No More’s mission is:

- providing up-to-date accurate information to families and friends of those struggling with problematic substance use.
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- supporting those who have lost loved ones to substance use or overdose through GRASP: Grief Recovery After a Substance Passing. We have grown from two face to face chapters of GRASP to over 75 across the US and Canada in the past 5 years. Our closed facebook support group is available 24/7 and has grown exponentially.
- to advocate for the end to the failed drug war policies and for positive science based, public health drug treatment modalities.
- We have and continue to be involved in legislative actions which support harm reduction, good samaritan laws,
